

- Development of Facility level M&R Guidelines & Designing of Pilot Project
  - The guidelines will promote development and implementation of MRV systems by each AMS, in line with respective national policies and economic perspectives, and will support strengthening regional transparency in the ASEAN Region in a bottom-up manner.
  - This is an important first-step towards the formation of potential regional collaboration through carbon pricing instruments.

#### Developing Information Platform on Transparency Actions

- There is a need in the ASEAN region for a regional information platform on GHG transparency activities. A place where regional trends and the situation of neighboring countries regarding GHG transparency can be shared.
- This platform will facilitate the exchange of knowledge and good practices among AMS and strengthen ASEAN's region-wide transparency activities.
- The Information Platform is intended to have a holistic approach to strengthen transparency activities in the ASEAN region, and to promote potential collaborations with SEA-MRV Network.

# Developing Guidelines



#### M&R Guidelines will:

- strengthen transparency of GHG emissions with the the private sector involvement in a bottom-up manner;
- be robust for GHG accounting and to be consistent with key international standards (IPCC, GHG Protocol);
- be flexible according to national circumstances of each country, by adopting step-wise approaches; and
- provide practical suggestions for policy makers and GHG reporters.

## Guidelines may include:



- Methodologies, (sector, scope and measuring GHG emissions)
- Reporting process,
- Steps for developing GHG measurement and reporting system, and (Institutional Arrangement, Private Sector engagement)
- Existing tools as useful resources
